PROCEDURES AND POLICIES (revised 2010)

The Section II soccer committee has adopted a series of statements regarding policies and procedures that they feel will cover most of the concerns of all the soccer coaches, athletic directors, and leagues regarding activities at the sectional and intersectional levels.

Any questions, additions or further recommendations, should be directed to the soccer committee through the league representative or the Section II soccer chairman.

I. LETTER OF INTENT:

The letter of intent form can be found on page 35 of the Section II handbook on the Section II web page, section2athletics.org. This form indicates the schools intent and/or chosen obligation to participate in post-season sectional and intersectional tournaments until the school is eliminated. This form is to be sent to the section chairman no later than October 15th!!!!!!

The state finals are played on Sunday, Nov. 21st for the year 2010. The letter of intent states that it is your intention to play until eliminated or to conclusion. Failure by a school/coach to submit the letter of intent to the soccer chairman by the indicated deadline will be an indication that your school does not wish to participate in the post-season sectional tournament. Subsequently, your team will not be considered or seeded in the tournament.

If, after submitting your letter of intent, your school decides it does not wish to enter the sectional tournament, you must so indicate that intent to either your league representative or the Section II chairman. This must be done before the sectional seeding meeting (see list of important sectional soccer dates item XVIII, page 20). **Failure to do so may cause your school to be denied the opportunity to play in next year's sectional tournament.**

II. SELECTION TO THE TOURNAMENT:

Starting with the 2002-2003 season the soccer tournament will be run as open sectionals. This is a change in policy that was voted on by the Athletic Council and passed by a 15-12 vote on 3/06/02.

Seeding will be based on league winning percentages. Spring of 2006, Athletic Council voted 14-11 in favor of using league records to determine sectional seeding. Voted down was a request to use a weighted objective system that took into account all games, and strength of schedule. Ultimately the committee has the authority to move any teams higher or lower to be determined by extenuating circumstances that are brought to the committee's attention, such as forfeits. Any teams that do not play a complete league schedule will be seeded as an independent and at the discretion of the entire soccer committee.

Seeding will be based upon league games completed only at the time of the seeding meeting. League schedules are to be completed before the seeding meeting. For seeding purposes schedules are frozen at the time of the seeding meeting. The date of the seeding meeting can be found on page 20.

Tournament formats other than the traditional format identified in item VII have been suggested. The committee is always open to innovative suggestions and formats that will make the post-season tournament more exciting. However, any deviations from the format identified in item VII that wish to be incorporated into the upcoming post season tournament must be acted upon prior to the halfway point of the current or upcoming season by the entire Section II soccer committee. All new suggestions should be made to your league representative or in writing to the Section II soccer chairman.

Formula to figure out your win/loss percentage

$$\text{Won/loss \%} = \frac{\text{league wins (ties counting } \frac{1}{2} \text{ a win)}}{\text{\# of league games}} \times 100$$

III. RESOLVING A PERCENTAGE TIE FOR SEEDING PURPOSES ONLY BETWEEN TWO AND THREE OR MORE TEAMS:

1. If the tie in percentages involves teams from the same league, the soccer committee will accept any approved league recommendation to break the tie.
2. If the league has no recommendation method for breaking the tie or if the two teams tied in percentages are from different leagues, then the committee will first consider head to head competition, followed by a coin flip to resolve the tie. The head to head competition will only consider won/loss/tie records and not the number of goals scored in the matches played.
3. If three or more teams are tied, again the league tiebreaker mechanism will be used. If teams are representatives of different leagues then their names will be thrown into a hat and drawn out at random by the section chairman. The first team drawn out of the hat will have the highest seed, the second team drawn will have the second seed, and so on down the line until all the teams are drawn out of the hat.

IV. PROCEDURES FOR BREAKING A TIE IN THE SECTIONAL TOURNAMENT:

If there is a tie at the end of regulation time, then the procedure for breaking that tie will be done in the following order until the tie is broken:

1. 2-15 minute sudden victory overtimes
2. penalty kick procedures as defined in the rule book

V. STARTING TIMES FOR MATCHES IN THE SECTIONAL TOURNAMENT:

It is recommended, where possible, that all sectional matches be played in the evening. This will have minimal interruption of the daily school activities and provide for the greatest spectator and fan support.

The criteria listed below are for play-in, preliminary and quarterfinal games. Semi-final and Final start times are based on field availability and are at the discretion of the Section II soccer committee and the Soccer Chairman.

1. All weekday afternoon matches will begin no later than 3:00 p.m.
2. A single weekday evening match will begin no later than 7:00 p.m.
3. A double header on a weekday evening will have the first match begin no later than 5:00 p.m. and the second match beginning 20 minutes after the end of the first one.
4. All matches on a weekend will begin at 1:30 p.m. unless both teams come to a mutual agreement that is approved by the Section II Chairman for a different starting time.
5. Under no circumstances will a daytime match be started after 3:30 p.m. without having lights available to provide adequate visibility.

Finals that are played on Saturday, November 6th – Class A – B – C and D, have had conflicts with SAT's in the past. Coaches and/or Athletic Directors should make their student/athletes aware of possible conflicts on Saturday, November 6, 2010. Student/athletes should schedule SAT's during another month to avoid such a conflict.

VI. PRELIMINARY AND QUARTERFINAL SECTIONAL MATCHES:

The committee will look at distance traveled but mileage **will not** be the determining factor in the selection of sectional sites. Generally all preliminary and quarterfinal games will be held at the site of the higher seeded team. All high schools that host preliminary and/or quarterfinal games must either charge admission (see item IX), or assume all financial responsibility for a successful game, and make all the necessary arrangements that need to be made to insure a properly run sectional game. See item IX regarding the general procedures for conducting a sectional soccer game. **If a school declines to take on the financial responsibility of the game then failure to charge admission by a school that hosts a preliminary and/or quarterfinal game could cause that school to forfeit its right to host a preliminary and/or quarterfinal game at a future date.**

VII. SECTIONAL AND INTERSECTIONAL CLASS COMPETITIONS:

There will be 5 different class competitions within Section II. The schools will be divided up into AA, A, B, C, and D classes. See the Section II classification sheet, page 23 & 24, or consult with your Athletic Director to find out which class your school belongs to.

1. All teams will be assigned to a division as indicated under the specific class tournament.
2. All teams in each division will be ranked according to their league win/loss percentage.
3. Admission will be charged for **ALL GAMES**, unless the host school accepts all financial responsibility for running the game.
4. Fields with combined football-soccer goal posts that have flat surfaces may be used for preliminary and quarterfinal games only.
5. All teams must have a legal size field (110 x 65) in order to host a sectional game. If a school does not have a legal size field, the game will be played on a neutral field that conforms to the specification. Schools knowingly hosting a game on an illegal field will forfeit their opportunity to host future games until they prove to the section II soccer committee that the problem has been rectified.
6. Game times during the weekday will start no later than 3:00 p.m. A single weekday evening game will start no later than 7:00 p.m.
7. Games will be played as follows:
 - Preliminary/Play-in games on Wednesday/Thursday
 - Quarterfinal/Preliminary games on Friday/Saturday/Monday
 - Semifinals on Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday
 - Finals to be announced
 - Above dates are subject to change due to are at the discretion of the boys soccer committee and the soccer chairman

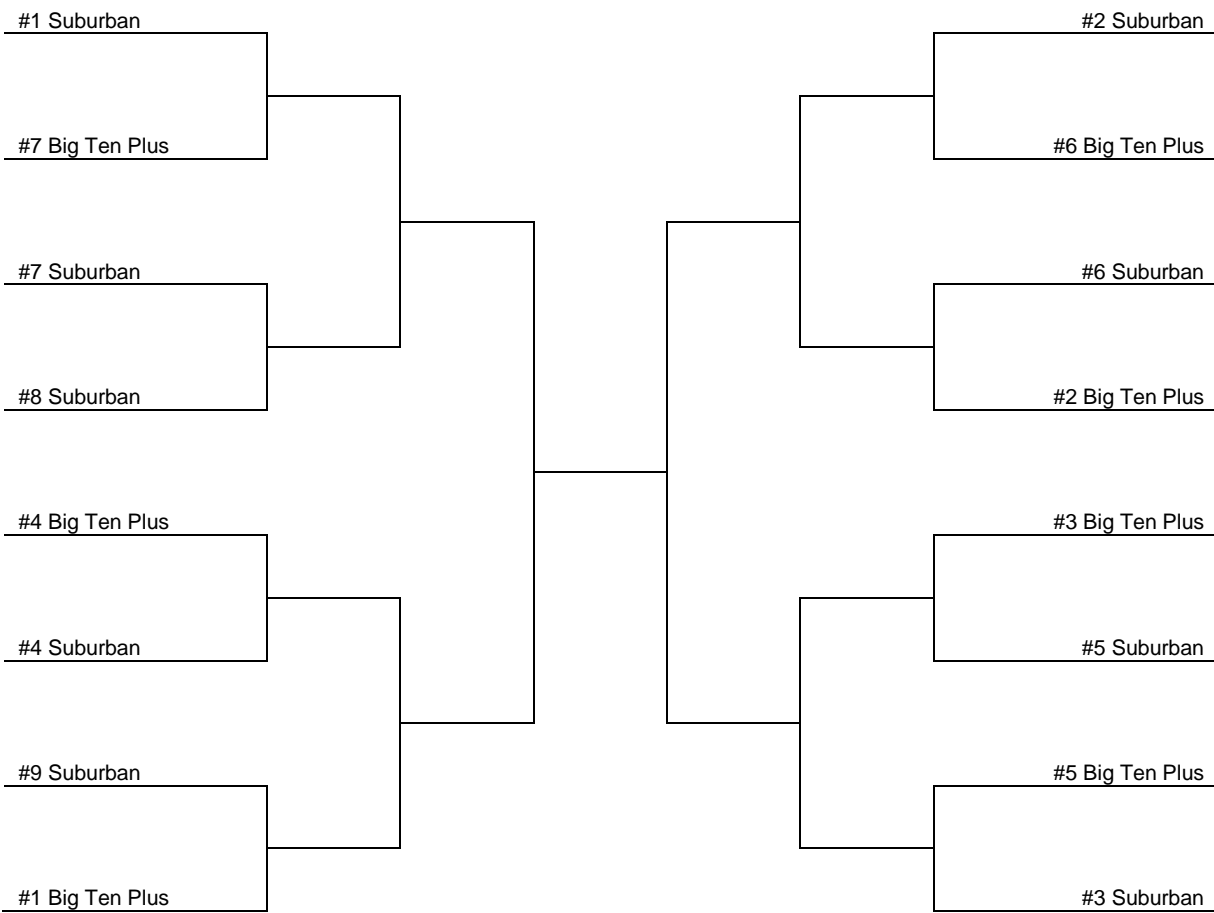

“AA” Tournament Seeding (Amended 7/08)



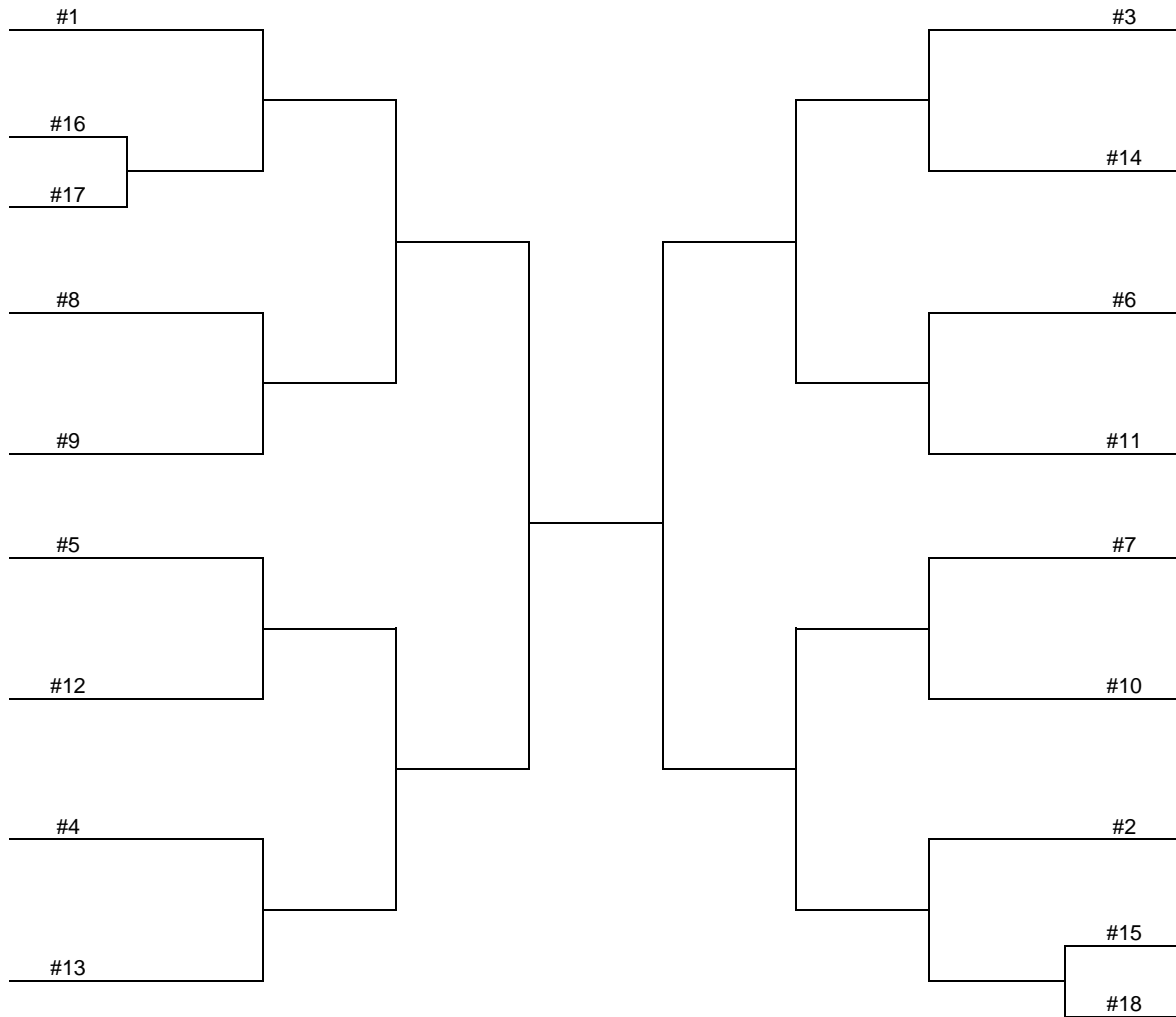
The Suburban Council seeding will be determined by the point system established by the Athletic Directors and coaches in the Suburban Council. The point system was approved because of and an uneven schedule within the Suburban Council.

2. Class “A” & “B” Tournament: (Class “A” amended 06/09 – see below)

1. The new format is to seed teams one through however many teams choose to participate in the sectionals. Both tournaments will have a cross section of teams from 4-5 leagues. Teams will be seeded based on their league records.

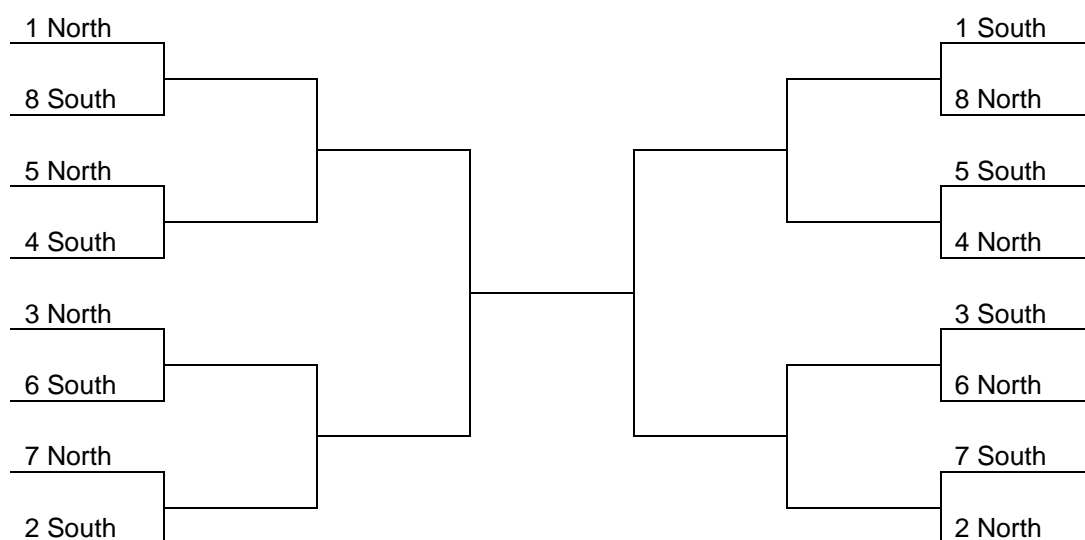
“A” Tournament Seeding (Amended 3/04)

Amended Class “A” Tournament – approved spring 2009

1. All Class “A” teams will be assigned to one of two divisions in a North/South Format (we used North/South for simplicity sake). This format will prevent league opponents from meeting in the opening round.
2. Each division will be seeded based on their league winning percentage.
3. This format will be used if there is a balance in the number of teams in each division (i.e. 7 north schools, 6 south schools).
4. If we went to 6 teams in one and 4 teams in the other bracket the committee would have the discretion to return to the original seeding process of just seeding them in this case 1-12, or however many teams are entered, based on league record.

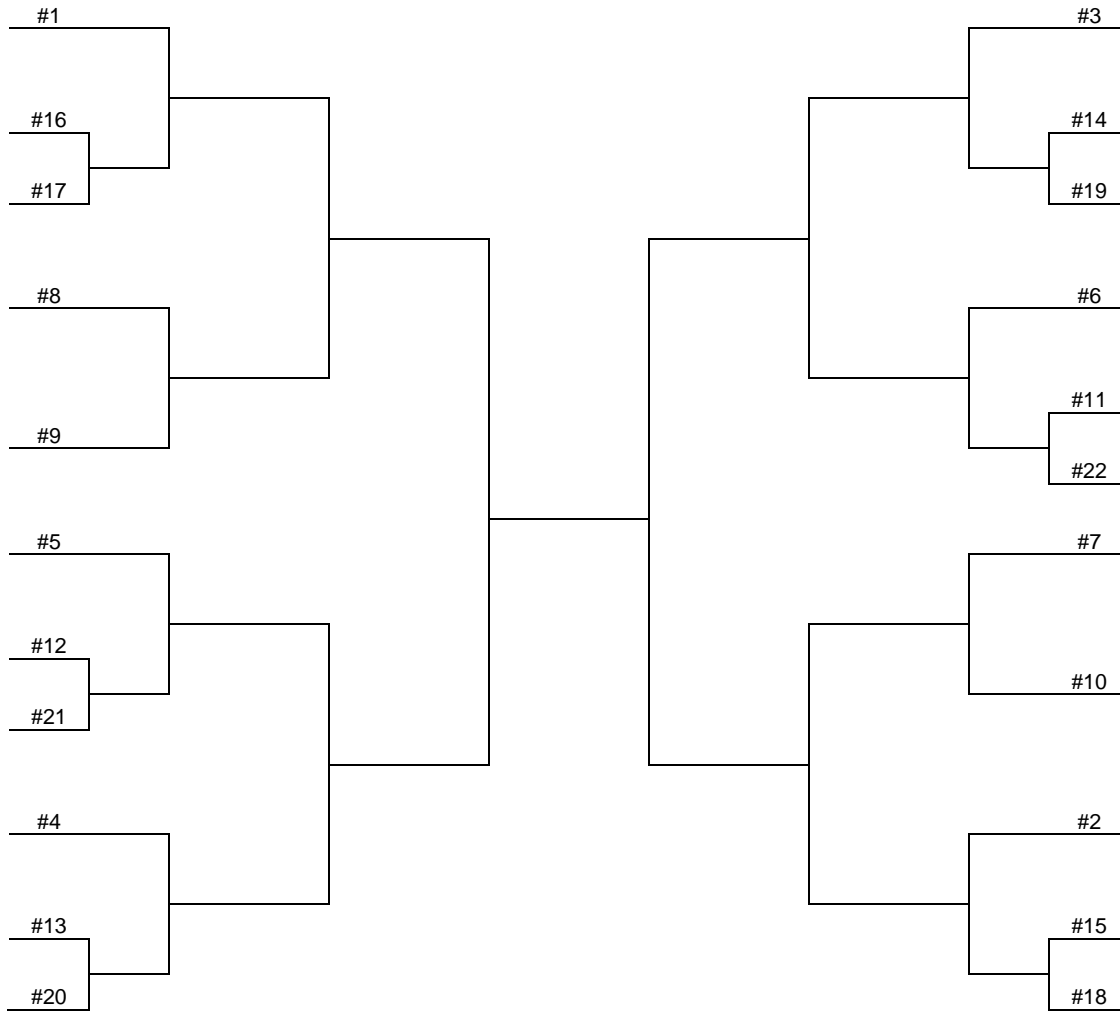

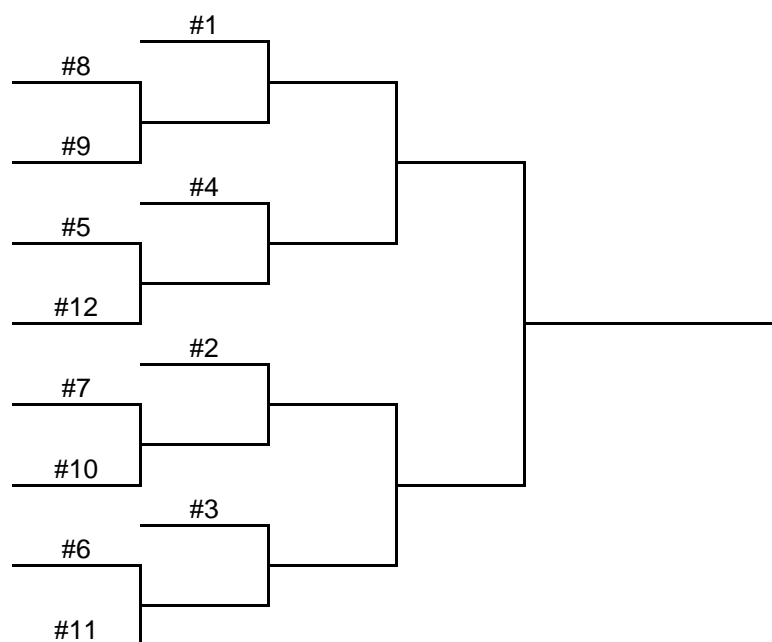
Starting with the 2010 season there will no a split in the Class C classification. Therefore the new brackets are shown below.



4. Class “D” Tournament:

Because of the limited number of teams presently in Class D teams beginning with the 2006 season will be seeded 1 through however many teams enter in sectional play.

For all classes: when two teams finish a sectional final in a tie, they will be declared Sectional Co-Champions. A penalty kick shootout will determine which team will advance to state level play.

VIII. SEEDINGS FOR A SECTIONAL TOURNAMENT:

The higher seeded team throughout the tournament will always be the home team and wear the light jersey. After the quarterfinal contests, all games will be played at a neutral site. All teams entered into the tournament should bring a clock, horn, scorekeeper, timekeeper, and one or more ball persons to the game. The higher seeded team will supply game balls.

*******All sectional champions should immediately contact the state soccer chairman, Mike Andrew, per instructions in the informational packet that is given to both the Coach and the Athletic Director by the Section II Chairman. Athletic Directors should contact Mike by phone the next day at the latest.*******

IX. TICKET PRICES – Preliminary/Quarterfinals/Semi-Finals & Finals (amended 6/01)

Ticket prices for all sectional soccer matches are **\$3.00 for everyone** except infants that are carried in. For the sectional semi-finals and finals all tickets will be **\$6.00 for everyone** except infants that are carried in. All coaches and school administrators should please inform all students and parents of these prices so there will be no conflicts at the gate. The only **PASSES** that will be accepted at the gate for free admission are sports coordinators passes, lifetime passes, and press passes. **Section II passes, league passes and passes from other sections will not be accepted.**

X. SECTIONAL AWARDS:

Following the championship game, the runner-up team will receive the runner-up plaque or trophy plus 25 maroon runner-up patches. The winner will receive the championship plaque or trophy plus 25 white championship patches. **There will be no extra patches given to teams.** Finally, there will be 25 certificates given out by the NYSPHSAA to the Section II class champions that go on to the state tournament to represent Section II.

XI. GENERAL PROCEDURES FOR HOSTING A SECTIONAL SOCCER MATCH

1. All soccer schools in Section II are expected to keep their facilities available for sectional and intersectional play until the third Saturday in November. Any school which fails to keep their facilities available will have this fact registered with the Section II President.
2. The following forms are needed to complete the paperwork for a sectional soccer game. (Forms are in the Section II Handbook at their web-site section2athletics.org pages, 22, 23 and 25). **Sectional Financial Report** (both sides), and **Section II Expense Claim Voucher**.
3. **All completed forms, plus a check for the receipts, should be sent by the site chairman to the Section II Treasurer with a copy of all paperwork sent to the Section II Soccer Chairman:**

A check which covers the admission fees, made out to **Roger Seward – Section II Treasurer** should be sent along with the paperwork. **If a school chooses to assume the financial responsibility for a preliminary and/or quarterfinal game please send paperwork showing that fact so both the section II soccer chairman and the section II treasurer are aware of that fact.**

4. It is the responsibility of the site chairman to make sure the **Sectional Financial Report and the Section II Expense Claim Vouchers** are completely and properly filled out and signed. Additionally, the site chairman shall secure ticket sellers and ticket takers, custodial help, supervision, etc., to make sure the game is run smoothly.
5. Scorekeepers are not reimbursed by the section for soccer contests. Timekeepers may be reimbursed once we have reached the semi-finals and beyond when there is a night game that has a scoreboard and a clock.

6. It is the responsibility of the Section II Soccer Chairman or his designee to secure officials for the game.
7. It is the responsibility of the site chairman to delegate a committee to handle appeals or protests at sectional contests. The site chairman may be a part of this committee.
8. There will be no change in a game site without the approval of the Section II Soccer Chairman.
9. Home coaches or site chairman should contact the Section II chairman, by phone or email, with game scores as soon as the game is completed. Section II chairman: Jim Gillis, 356-4261, jgillis@bkwcsd.k12.ny.us
10. Any questions regarding the administration of a sectional match should be directed to the Soccer Chairman or his designee. **When in doubt ask!**

XII. PROCEDURES FOR SECTIONAL TOURNAMENT COORDINATORS:

1. Coordinators or his designee must secure game sites and site chairman for all matches.
2. Coordinators or his designee must inform all teams where they are going to play, at what time, who is to wear the light and dark jersey, and to remind all teams to bring a horn, a clock, a scorekeeper, timer, and at least 1 ball person. The higher seeded team will provide game balls.
3. **Coaches of winning teams should contact the section II chairman with the results of the games.** Coordinators should contact the major papers, especially the Daily Gazette, Times Union, and Troy Record with all scores reported to them as well as future playing sites, times and teams involved. See pages 25 and 26 for the phone numbers of the media.
4. The referee assignor, **John Hogan (584-7583)**, should be contacted and told which teams are playing, where they are playing and when they are playing.
5. The coordinators should make sure that tickets, vouchers and sectional financial report forms are available to the site chairman. Site chairman are responsible for securing ticket sellers, ticket takers, supervision, custodial help (if necessary), the field set-up, proper completion of all vouchers and financial report forms, and anything else that is necessary to run a successful tournament match.
6. The coordinator should arrange to secure trophies, up to 25 patches, and have a plan to present the awards to the teams in the finals.

7. **The coordinator should remind the class champion that they should immediately review the State Tournament informational packet given to both the coach and Athletic Director by the Section II Chairman. The Athletic Director should contact State Coordinator Mike Andrew, by the next day, after winning the sectional championship.**
8. Coordinators should work with each other to secure night games and where possible, double-headers. Coordination of final games so that they are not all going on at the exact same time, and any other duties such as dispersing tickets, trophies, forms, etc., so that the tournament will run smoothly.
9. The Soccer Chairman should approve any questions regarding procedures or changes of any kind.
10. Coordinators should submit a voucher to the Soccer Chairman for any expenses that are section related such as mileage to pick up or deliver trophies, tickets, phone calls involving sectional business, etc.
11. **The 2010 Section II Finals will be played with the Brine NCAA ball** as provided by the Section 2 Soccer Committee. There will be no exceptions. Regionals, semi-finals and finals will use the same ball as provided under the sponsorship of **Brine Sporting Goods** and the state soccer committee.

XIII. PROCEDURES FOR INTERSECTIONAL TOURNAMENT COORDINATORS:

1. Find out from the Section II Soccer Chairman which section our class champion representative will be playing and in which section.
2. If the game is in our section you should secure a playing site and a site chairman. Consult with the Section II Soccer Chairman before you finalize a site. Then notify the teams, papers, and most importantly, the referee's assignor, **John Hogan (584-7583)**.
3. Call the soccer Chairman from the section where the opponent for our class representative will come from. Refer to the list of intersectional soccer chairman (Page 21) found in this directory to obtain the specific phone number.
4. The phone call to the appropriate chairman identified above should involve getting the name of the corresponding sectional class champion school, an individual contact and phone number where the contact can be reached.

XIV. IF SECTION II IS THE HOST SECTION FOR AN INTERSECTIONAL MATCH, THE COORDINATOR SHOULD:

1. Give the rival contact person directions to the game site, a person to contact when they arrive so that changing and showering accommodations can be made (give a phone number where the contact can be reached should there be complications). Any local restaurants (and phone numbers) where they may eat before or after the game. Also the match particulars, game time, the jersey color (light or dark) they should wear, and remind them to bring a horn, clock, game balls, scorekeeper, timer and one or more ball persons. Inform the contact of the name of the school his class representative will be playing.

XV. IF A SECTION II TEAM IS TRAVELING TO ANOTHER SECTION, THE TOURNAMENT COORDINATOR SHOULD:

1. Get the directions to the playing facility, identify a contact person at the playing facility for the Section II team to seek out when they arrive (try and get the contact persons telephone number). Obtain the phone number and names of any restaurants that the Section II class representative may wish to eat at before or after the game. Get the game particulars such as game time, jersey color (light or dark) the team should wear, the time of the game, and help secure a bus by calling **Brown Bus Company at 1-800-424-4700**. Also remind the Section II team to bring a horn, clock, game balls, scorekeeper, timer, and one or more ball persons.
2. If a sectional team must stay overnight, then the coordinator should obtain from the host chairman the names and phone numbers of any motels that the Section II team may wish to stay at. Motel accommodations will be provided for Section II teams only when the site is in excess of a 2-hour ride. **All overnight accommodations must be cleared through the Section II Soccer Chairman, Jim Gillis, and Section II treasurer, Fred Gula.**
3. Remind Section II teams that when they travel, the section will pay for only 30 people (players, coaches, managers, and other soccer-related personnel). Spectators will not be allowed on the bus. The coordinator must determine what meals they will need.

The rates for meals are:

Breakfast - \$6.00

Lunch \$6.00

Dinner \$12.00

(These prices include the tip)

*Note: Cost of meals may not be combined, (i.e. you may not skip breakfast and lunch and have a \$24.00 Dinner).

Section II teams playing within the section for regional games are allowed either a bus or a meal, not both. **If they choose one of the two options above they need to make the Section II Chairman aware of their choice.** If a person, company or school wishes to get reimbursed, then properly filled out and signed vouchers, accompanied by receipts, must be sent to the Soccer Chairman. If a team stays overnight, the section will not pay for personal phone calls. However, sectional business phone calls will be paid for.

4. It is the responsibility of the coordinator to contact the official's assignor and the major papers to let them know the game site, day it will be played, and time of game and competing teams.
5. Schools participating in post season play must make sure that the **Post Sectional Competition Form** is completely filled out and submitted to Roger Seward for **EACH TRIP** out of the section. This form gives a guideline for each expense incurred by a school when traveling to another section for post season competition.

XVI. FIELD DIMENSIONS AND GOAL POSTS;

- Starting in 1988, there will be **no intersectional games played on any fields with dimensions of less than 65 yards wide and 110 yards long.** Additionally, combination football/soccer goal posts cannot be used. These dimensions will apply to sectional games starting in 1989 and may determine whether a team can host an opening round sectional game. **No Section II tournament game will be played on a field that does not meet the minimal standards.**

NYSPHSAA Yellow Card Accumulation Policy

It is the intention of the NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship Committee to address the issue of the accumulation of Yellow Cards during the soccer season by an individual player/coach. The situations surrounding Red Cards are dealt with directly under the NYSPHSAA Guidelines for Sportsmanship and Misconducts outlined in the State Handbook for all sports. The consequences for the accumulation of excessive Yellow Cards will be as follows:

1. Five Yellow Cards accumulated by a single player/coach in the regular season will result in a one game suspension. Disqualifications due to an accumulation of five yellow cards occurring in the last game of the season will carry over into the next season of participation, if the team does not enter post season play.
2. The continued accumulation of Yellow Cards by the same individual will result in a one game suspension per additional Yellow Card.
3. In the event that the player receives two Yellow Cards in the same game, resulting in a Red Card, the two Yellow Cards will not count toward the season total, since the player/coach will receive a one game suspension as a result of the misconduct and ejection.
4. The accumulation card total is for regular season play only and the process will start over again for post season play. However, any penalties awarded as a result of the last regular season game will carry over into the post season.
5. The post season policy will provide a one game suspension after three Yellow Cards and a one game suspension for each additional card received through the State Final. A one game suspension resulting from a yellow card in a team's last post season game will carry over into the next season of participation.
6. The coaches of both schools are to report all Yellow Cards to their League and Section by means of Mail, E-mail or Fax for tabulation. The officials should report to their boards concerning games in which cards are given and the reasons for issuance of the card. Board policy will determine the method of notification to the League and Section. A final end of the year report including data on disqualifications shall be sent to the NYSPHSAA Sportsmanship Coordinator.
7. Refusing to report, or failing to report infractions and allowing players/coaches to continue play/coach under these circumstances will result in the forfeiture of all games in which the individual in question participated.

All coaches in Section 2 are required to contact Section 2 soccer chairman, Jim Gillis, by email jgillis@bkwcsd.k12.ny.us , following every game that they have participated in where a card(s) has been issued. This needs to be done whether it was your team or the opponent that was issued the card. Information to be included should be date of game, team that the player issued the card(s) plays for, players name, players jersey number, and the card(s) received. This should be done the day of, or no later than the next school day after the contest. If no cards are issued in a given contest then no report is required. Failure to report cards in the above time frame could result in the suspension of coaches and forfeiture of all games in which the individual player in question participated. This policy is in effect for regular season play, sectional play and state tournament play.

DEFINATION OF A SOCCER SCRIMMAGE:

A soccer scrimmage may not exceed a total of 100 minutes and unlimited substitutions are permitted. The length of time for the periods of play is to be determined by the coaches, not to exceed 40 minutes in any one period: halves, three periods or quarters. Scoreboards may be used for timekeeping only. The clock will begin with the goalkeeper in possession of the ball. When a goal is scored, play will be restarted with goalie possession. The goalie can restart play with a goal kick, goalie throw or goalie punt.

- Hourly RealFeel Temperature (Heat index) will be checked 1 hour before the contest/practice by a certified athletic trainer, athletic director, or school designee when the air temperature is 80 degrees (Fahrenheit) or higher.

- STEPS TO OBTAIN HOURLY REALFEEL TEMPERATURE:**

Log onto **AccuWeather.com** by using the association website, www.nysphsaa.org, we recommend saving this site to your computer or phone.

Once you have entered the zip code for your practice or contest site you will see the home page for the local forecast. **DO NOT USE THE REALFEEL TEMPERATURE ON THIS PAGE.**

Click onto **HOURLY FORECAST**, and you will be linked to a chart. Please use the current hour RealFeel temperature for your zip code to take the appropriate action for your practice or contest.

- If the Hourly RealFeel temperature (heat index) is 90 degrees or above, the athletic trainer, athletic director, or school designee must re-check the Hourly RealFeel temperature(heat index) at halftime or midway point of the contest. If the Hourly RealFeel temperature (heat index) is 96 degrees (Fahrenheit) or more, the contest will be suspended.

Re: NFHS Concussion Rule

This memo is to serve as a clarification of the NFHS Concussion Rule, effective for the 2010-2011 school year, for the sports that use the NFHS rules.

The NFHS Concussion Rule states, “*Any athlete who exhibits signs, symptoms or behaviors consistent with a concussion (such as loss of consciousness, headaches, dizziness, confusion or balance problems) shall be immediately removed from the contest and shall not return to play until cleared by an appropriate health-care professional*”. The NFHS emphasizes in the concussion rule that **coaches and officials are NOT expected to “diagnose” a concussion**. This is the responsibility of the appropriate health-care professional.

The responsibility for observing signs, symptoms, and behaviors that are consistent with a concussion is shared by both sport officials and school officials. The following protocol should be followed if any signs, symptoms or behaviors are observed.

Sport official: Remove the athlete from the contest. The official is NOT responsible for the sideline evaluation or the management of the athlete once they have been removed from the game. The official does not have to receive any paper work clearing the player to return to the game.

School official: The athlete needs to be **assessed** by an *appropriate health care professional*. **School health personnel are considered appropriate health care professionals. School health personnel include the Chief School Medical Officer, school nurse, physician, certified athletic trainer or an EMT that is a member of the onsite EMS squad. If the appropriate health care professional suspects a concussion, the student athlete MAY NOT return to the contest. The athlete MAY Not return to play if *the appropriate health care professional is not available*. The NFHS and NYSPHSAA recommend that any athlete that suffers a concussion should not return to play the day of the injury. **A student Athlete that has been diagnosed with a concussion MUST be cleared by the Chief School Medical Officer****

The NFHS and NYSPHSAA have developed many resources to help school officials, sport officials, parents, and students learn more about concussion management. A concussion DVD, sideline cards, and other useful materials can be found on the NYSPHSAA website (www.nysphsaa.org). A cost free concussion management course can be found on the NFHS website (www.nfhslearn.com).

We have included a list of possible signs, symptoms, and behaviors that can be observed by sport officials and school officials. We have also included for school officials a recommended return to play protocol. We encourage anyone that has questions or concerns to contact the NYSPHSAA office or the Section Concussion Management Team.

SIGNS, SYMPTOMS, AND BEHAVIORS OF A POSSIBLE HEAD TRAUMA

1. Problems in Brain Function

- a. **Confused state** – Dazed look, vacant stare, confusion about what happened or is happening.
- b. **Memory problems** – Can't remember assignment on play, opponent, score of game, or period of the game. Can't remember how or with whom he or she traveled to the game, what he or she is wearing, what was eaten for breakfast etc.
- c. **Symptoms reported by athlete** – Headache, nausea, or vomiting, blurred or double vision, oversensitivity to sound, light or touch, ringing in the ears, feeling foggy or groggy.
- d. **Lack of sustained attention** – Difficulty sustaining focus adequately to complete a task or a coherent thought or conversation.

2. **Speed of Brain Function:** Slow response to questions, slow slurred speech, incoherent speech, slow body movements, slow reaction time.

3. **Unusual Behaviors:** Behaving in a combative, aggressive or very silly manner, or just atypical for the individual. Repeatedly asking the same question over and over. Restless and irritable behavior with constant motion and attempts to return to play or leave. Reactions that seem out of proportion and inappropriate. Changing position frequently and having trouble resting or finding a comfortable position. These can be manifestations of post-head trauma difficulties.

4. **Problems with Balance and Coordination:** Dizzy, slow, clumsy movements, inability to walk a straight line or balance on one foot with eyes closed.

Recommended Return to Play Protocol

Day 1: No exertional activity until medically cleared and asymptomatic for 24 hours.

Day 2: Begin low-impact activity such as walking, stationary bike, etc.

Day 3: Initiate aerobic activity fundamental to specific sport such as skating, running, etc.

Day 4: Begin non-contact skill drills specific to sport such as dribbling, ground balls, batting, etc.

Day 5: Full contact in practice setting

If the athlete remains without symptoms, he or she may return to play.

Special note: Athlete must remain asymptomatic to progress to next day.
If symptoms return, the athlete must return to the previous level.
Medical check should occur before contact.
